A. Jeffrey Rawlings – Update

- i. Men's shelter full...added bunk beds and full; Women's shelter completely full
- ii. Both have lowered their barriers-ID requirement has been relaxed, agree to do chores or help they can stay all day, don't have to go to their church
- iii. Brad is contact for both shelters
- iv. Bottleneck
- v. Hotel/motel burning through funds...hasn't been cold enough
- vi. Tripled allotment for rapid rehousing funds
- vii. The more providers we have doing rapid rehousing, the better
- viii. Rapid rehousing primary goal is to have them housed in 30 days
- ix. Volunteers of America & Family Endeavors
- x. Went to conference in California-received a lot of data to share (Coalition to End Homelessness-Youth and Families) shared experiences and discussions from the trip
 1. Our area is on track-housing first model-then focus on getting help and resources
 2. App national alliance to end homelessness
 3. Sessions of interest-Rapid Rehousing in a Tight Rental Market; From Theory to Practice-Navigating Coordinated Entry; The Find-Getting Landlords to Say Yes in a Difficult Market; Data to Rural Communities; Childcare, Rapid Rehousing, and Employment; Progressive Engagement Approach to Rapid Rehousing Financial Assistance; Coordinated Entry and Dynamic Prioritization; Landlords are the Solution
 4. Plenary lunches were wonderful-videoed and posted

- xii. Hot Pads is a site for looking for places to rent
- xiii. There is not a national model for coordinated entry, and there will not be. It is not a cookie cutter mold. We can add to the PIT count survey and coordinated entry to make it relevant for our
- xiv. Certification program-teaching how to be good employees and tenants (JLCA)
- xv. Bel-flex coming to the table to help gain employment
- xvi. Jobs for Life class coming up through Salvation Army
- xvii. JCLA starting to double up individuals when possible...they are tracked separately, but are housed at the same location
- xviii. Want to develop a S3 Landlord list-already vetted and certified the individuals-stamp of approval
- xix. Will we prepared and how much will we be able to do to ease it when the wake county and Cumberland county areas reach us with their expansions?
- xx. July-Conference in DC on homelessness
- xxi. 5 mil 82 th 59-census population of NC
- xxii. Racism and housing-segregated housing didn't begin until public housing began-government built housing-it was market rate and not subsidized; FHA formed and brought whites out of the cities; had covenants that didn't allow the sale of homes to minorities (book-Crisis of Law)
