

## **S3 Agency Reports**

**United Way of Lee County**'s fall fundraising campaign continues; everyone is encouraged to donate either through their workplace campaign or at [www.leecountyunitedway.org/donate](http://www.leecountyunitedway.org/donate). We are continuing to source PPE and other COVID-related supplies and are distributing these items to local agencies as they are available.

**Family Promise** is currently full with 3 families on the waiting list. Our families are doing really well. The items we need are paper towels, trash bags (13 gal), and toilet paper.

**Lee County Libraries** (current as of 12/9/20):

- The library continues to offer modified hours due to the pandemic. Public access hours are Monday through Friday from 12 PM – 4 PM for 30-minute browsing (grab and go only) or 60-minute computer use appointments. Computer appointments can be made online, over the phone or in-person. Curbside Pick-up Service continues Monday – Friday 10 am – 4 pm with extended hours until 7 pm on Tuesdays.
- “Print from home” is available to patrons through our website. Patrons can submit print jobs from home and schedule a pick up at the library during curbside hours.
- Free Public Wi-Fi is available in our parking lots 24/7.
- Book drops are open 24/7. The main library book drop is emptied daily.
- Currently the Broadway branch remains closed however we continue to empty the book drop twice a week and pull holds from the collection.
- Staff is available by phone Monday through Friday between 9 am – 5 pm and on Tuesdays until 7 pm for reference questions and general assistance.

**Salvation Army**: I believe we still need a few bell ringers and our angel tree distribution will be a drive through on Friday.

**Sanford Jobseekers** is helping with resumes and job leads on an individual basis.

**H3** will do an outreach to the Palomino Dec. 10 from 1-3 pm. Also involved are: Project Catch with Deb Thompson, Salvation Army with food, Max Dolan with veterans, Reach Out Crisis Pregnancy. Will do Covid testing, flu shots, and free medical care.

**OMI** served 32 clients in November. We had 10 new clients enter the shelter and 9 clients exit the shelter. We only have 1 client whose stay exceeds 90 days. Our new Housing Specialist, Priscilla Ward, is actively working on landlord recruitment and housing availability database development. A Christmas meal and gifts for children recently in the shelter will be provided by the Lemon Springs Ruritan Club. Donations toward work clothing or Christmas gift bags for our clients will be greatly appreciated.

**Reach Out Crisis Pregnancy Center**: We are filled with HOPE for 2021 and what God’s doing at Reach Out. This year has been filled with blessings and challenges. The Lord has been faithful to his WORD and we continue to serve this community with JOY and Christ’s LOVE. Thank you for your support, prayers,
