Sandhills Center, Quiotti Ratliffe- Sandhills Center continues to work remotely with the option of working from the office per request. We continue our efforts to search for safe, affordable housing availability within our catchment areas. Please contact Brenda Goss Transition Housing Specialist @ 910-673-7773 should there be any private landlords or property managements, that are willing to provide affordable housing. Emergency Housing Voucher referrals can be submitted through Coordinated Entry, for those individuals who are experiencing Homeliness.

Brick Capital CDC, Kerry Bashaw- Brick Capital is starting the construction of five new houses this month and plans to start four more houses next month, all to be completed by the end of the year. We also are finishing up on our plans for a new subdivision that will include a 16-unit apartment complex and 45 single family homes. In addition, we are hoping to hear back from HUD soon regarding our CoC application for funding for permanent supportive housing to Region 7.

Bread of Life, John Paschal- Food Pantry-223 people served, Saturday meal: served 40-60 people each Saturday of month, 431 Global Ministries-Served a meal each Sunday of the Month, providing food for meals at Outreach Mission, sharing what we have with Salvation Army. We are having several building improvement projects going on. See Salvation Army and Outreach mission reports for their activities that we support.

Total Package, Crystal Mckiver- Total Package Reentry Mindset classes are Tuesday 10am to 12pm. At 2516 Fayetteville Street Sanford NC. Currently we are developing recruitment efforts.

Outreach Mission, Inc, Hamer Carter- OMI served 47 clients in February, 25 men and 22 women and children. We had 22 clients exit, 12 left with jobs and 11 left for stable housing. We served 2 veterans and only had 1 client with a stay greater than 90 days. OMI operated under the adverse weather policy for 20 days in Feb. Our Street Outreach Program continues to grow with additional volunteers coming on board.

H3, Cindy Hall- H 3. We have been very busy— saw 22 between the Nav Center and Prince Tuesday. We have two more docs that have volunteered to fill in. Using the Piccolo machine to do blood panels. Had 2 patients pass away in the last several weeks but added 9-10 new patients. Hard to lose people. Working on getting our own 501-3C status. Had lots of cold meds donated. Looking at holding a dental clinic in the coming weeks.
