Lee County Library, Brittany Newman- is open 9am-5pm Monday, Wednesday, and Friday; 9am-8pm Tuesday and Thursday; and 12pm-4pm on Saturday. Library cards are free to Lee County residents and can be applied for with a picture ID. Computers are available for anyone to use with a library card or guest pass. New programs and services are offered every day! Visit the library website for our up-to-date programming: library.leecountync.gov The library will be closed November 25th-28th 2021, December 23rd-27th, December 31st, and January 1st.

Bread of Life, John Paschal- signed MOU to continue with Salvation Army Navigation Center until June 2022, Food Pantry - 210 people served, Served every Saturday a lunch meal with over 50 people per Saturday.

Needs: Pillows, singles sheets, both fitted and flat, Gloves, hats, socks, coats.

OMI, Hamer Carter- sheltered 32 clients last month and placed 7 clients in stable housing. OMI continues to email out our current bed availability every Monday and Friday. If you wish to be included on this email, please contact Hamer Carter at OMI. Our Street Outreach program is identifying locations where homeless individuals are congregating in the downtown Sanford and surrounding areas. Individuals are provided emergency basic needs including information on our homeless shelters and navigation center resources. Preparations continue for the opening of the Adverse Weather Shelter on November 15th if needed. Currently 16 beds will be available, 6 for women and 10 for men, intake will be at the OMI office at 705 Chatham Street.

Current needs for OMI include (1) volunteers to help staff the adverse weather shelter and (2) bath towels and wash cloths.
