



### S3 Housing Connect Agency Reports

- **The Navigation Center**, Darla Molina- The Navigation Center is in need of bottled water, disposable bowls, breakfast meats, laundry detergent and toilet paper.
- **Bread of Life**, John Paschal- Bread of Life for November- Food Pantry- We served 250 people, we had meals every Saturday, serving 50-75 people and also got started back serving out Homebound list. We had 3 different groups do a Thanksgiving meal. We have received many of the Food Lion food boxes and have given them out to anyone in need. We continue to work with Outreach mission about the extreme weather shelter, trying our best to direct everyone to the men's shelter between 5-6 PM, and they make the decision of when to open the Bread of Life site. Navigation Center-please see their numbers but very busy. Dr. Hall and H3 have seen many patients in November but had a week or so out of town. We have had 3 new churches supporting our mission in November.
- **H3**, Cindy Hall- H3 saw 120 people in November. (Even though we were gone the week of Thanksgiving) We have 4 nurses who volunteer and now have Dr. Sloan helping too. She is married to a dentist so we hope to soon provide dental care and not have to refer it out. The new Piccolo blood machine has arrived and we have been drawing blood samples. Donations are coming in very well so no needs right now.
- **Reach Out Crisis Pregnancy Center**, Dianna Andrews- We are in need of size 6 diapers! We are so grateful for the support of the community!
- **Sandhills Center**, Quiotti Ratliffe- has expanded its catchment area now serving 11 counties. Rockingham County & Davidson County are now a part of Sandhills service area formerly managed by Cardinal Innovations effective Dec 1, 2021. Sandhills Center continues to work remotely with the option of working from the office per request. We continue our efforts to search for safe, affordable housing availability within our catchment areas.
- **OMI**, Hamer Carter- In November OMI served 47 clients, 26 men and 21 women. We had 26 client exits. We provided 142 client referrals to other agencies for services. OMI placed 8 clients in stable housing situations.  
OMI initiated the Adverse Weather Shelter process on November 15<sup>th</sup>. So far, we have been able to absorb these clients into our current shelters without opening the overflow shelter at BOL. Current needs are male volunteers to work the nightshift (12-8 am) at the Adverse Weather Shelter. OMI raised over \$6700 with our "Home for the Holidays" playhouse raffle.
